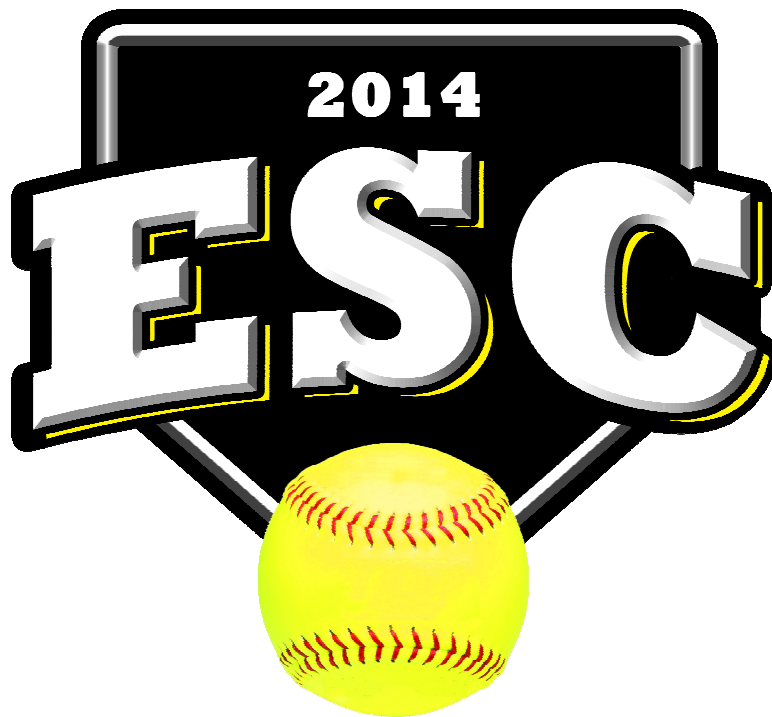
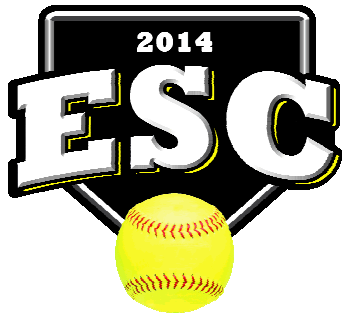

TOURNAMENT RECAP

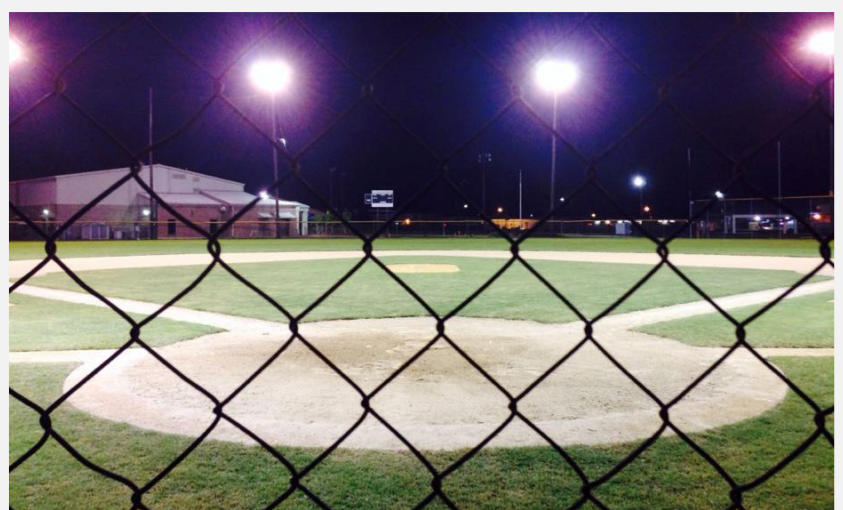

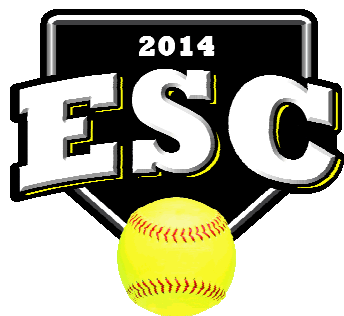
Although the weeks leading up to the event were chaotic and full of challenges, once the first pitch was thrown, I believe everything ran very smoothly. The radar and forecast looked discouraging, and throughout the day, rain threatened, but fortunately it held out all day long.

Once again, we had an amazing turnout. In my opinion, the level of competition was also raised from last year. There were some exciting games played throughout the day ending with CDI edging out Jacobs to claim the championship.

The mission statement for the ESC tournament is to "provide a means for friendly competition between business competitors while giving current and former co-workers a chance to build relationships outside of a workplace environment." Not to be lost in that is also the commitment to charity. Last year, we raised \$8,602.58 for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. This year we wanted to raise even more. While we were expanding the amount of teams this year, thus increasing the income for the tournament, getting the second field playable incurred some major expenses. Arkel Constructors graciously donated a major portion of the labor to get the field playable again, but we still had to cover a decent amount.

Because of those planned expenses, we set our goal for this year at \$10,000. I am pleased to say that this year, the Engineering Softball Classic raised \$15,522.33.

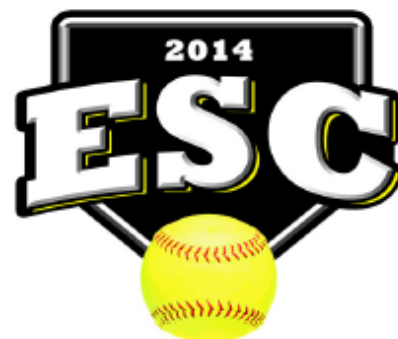
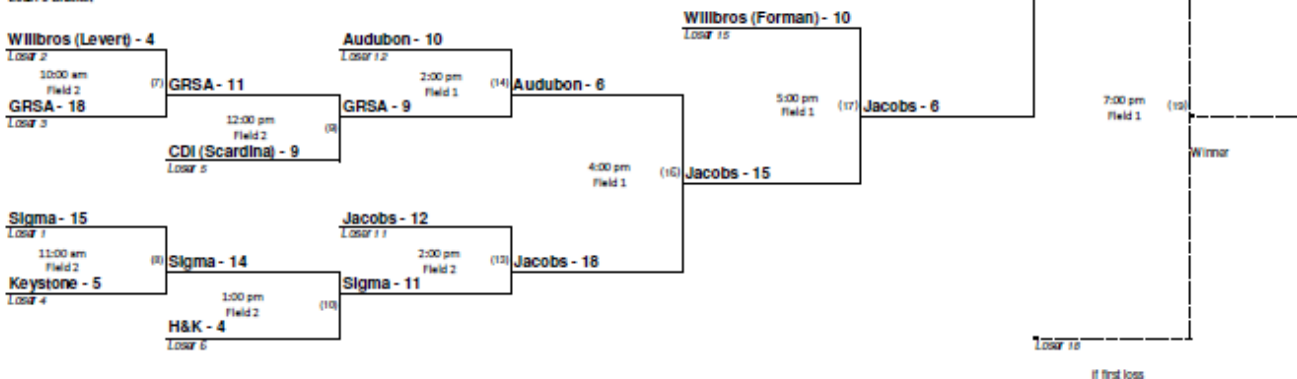
FINAL BRACKET

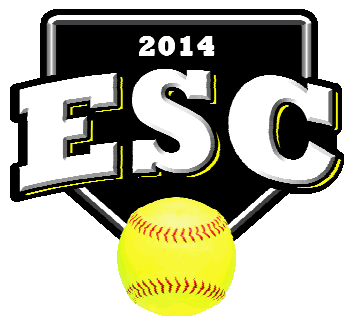

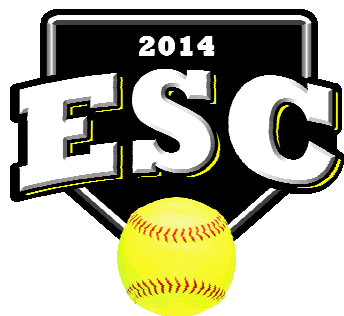
