


TOURNAMENT RECAP




TOURNAMENT RECAP


As we say each year, the goal of the ESC every year is to create a fun environment where people can interact with current co-workers, former co-workers, as well as people from other business competitors. We also raise money for a great cause in St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. We have been very fortunate over the past 5 years to have received a huge amount of support from the engineering and construction communities in the Baton Rouge area.

Many have heard the story before of when Dan Forman and Tom Polito set out to host the inaugural Engineering Softball Classic back in 2013. Not knowing what the level of interest would be in the event, they set a goal of raising \$1,000 for charity. That first year, the support and interest was overwhelming, and the total amount donated to charity was \$8,602.58.

Fast-forwarding to this year, the fifth annual ESC event, the interest and support has grown significantly. Despite all of the challenges this year, the ESC event raised **\$24,554.33**. That brings the five year total amount of money donated to the St. Jude Children's Research

Hospital to **\$100,095.61!**
